University of Maryland School of Dentistry PROCEDURES AND SUBMISSION FORM FOR FACULTY NOMINATIONS OF UMB HONORARY DOCTORAL DEGREE CANDIDATES

UMB is authorized to grant honorary degrees only with the approval of the University System of Maryland Board of Regents. School of Dentistry faculty may nominate candidates for an honorary doctoral degree. Nominations must be submitted to the Dean's Office no later than March 1 for consideration in same calendar year. Recommendations to the UMB President must be submitted by the Dean's Office.

Strict confidentiality must be ensured at all stages of the honorary degree conferral process. Under no circumstances should a prospective candidate be informed that he or she is under consideration for honorary degree nomination. There should be no communication with prospective degree recipients regarding the likely conferral of a degree until official approval has been granted by the Board of Regents. Letters of support should not be solicited on behalf of the nominee.

According to University of Maryland, Baltimore Policy on the Awarding of Honorary Degrees (III-3.00 (A), Amended October 16, 2019) prospective recipients of honorary doctoral degrees shall have:

- i. risen to a position of eminence in their chosen field or have acquired a national or international reputation in a selected field or endeavor; or
- ii. compiled a record of distinguished public service to the community, State, or nation; or
- iii. performed a particular feat of heroism (astronauts, explorers, military leaders, etc.)

Honorary degree candidates are generally recognized for their achievements and distinction in the sciences, public service, and the humanities.

Any faculty member of the School of Dentistry community can make a nomination. Conominators recommended but not required; maximum of two.

Complete the Honorary Degree Nomination Form and attach the required supporting documents, within the published deadlines and including:

- a. candidate's curriculum vitae, biographical sketch or comparable document
- b. justification for nomination, reflecting aforementioned standards and including a summary statement of personal and professional conduct and appropriateness, not to exceed 2 pages.
